United Church of Canada Archives Winnipeg Series 528/1 Fellowship of Professional Women REPORT OF THE MANITOBA CONFERENCE DEACONESS BOARD, 1925-6

Mr. President and Members of the Manitoba Conference: Your Board on peaconess work appointed by the former Methodist Conference begs to report as follows:

Your Board at its farst meeting after Conference organized with the following officers: Chairman - Rev. R. E. MCCullagh, Vice-Chairman Judge F. A. E. Hamilton, Sec. - E. H. Morgan, Treas. - J. H. Tozeland, Finance Committee Chairman - Judge gamilton.

The Board's work has fallen into two departments, namely (1) the management of deaconess matters in the Conference, and (2) the management of the Gimli Fresh Air Camp. we shall report upon these

separately.

The Board has had three deaconesses and one special worker doing desconess duries under its charge. Miss C. J. Collinson was appointed to First Church, Brandon for her third wear where her work has been very satisfactory. This church financed her salary. Miss _dith Sherwin has been at Sutherland Ave. Mission as girls' worker, and has been most highly commended by her superintendent, Rav. J. M. Shaver, for her labors and the success attending them. Miss Pearson has spent her first year in the Conference at Maclean Mission under Rav. A. W. Kenner who reports most favorably of her. The Board has also had a worker in place of a deaconess in the person of Miss G. Yeomans as a kindergatten assistant at Sutherland Ave. Misaion.

It is the feeling of the board that great credit is due these workers. Their unswerving loyalty to the work, their untiring efforts, their kindly Christian spirit are examples to Christian workers everywhere, while thair very lives are armakes demonstrations in the communities where they labor of the true spirit of Christ. They work in parts of the city where many would gladly escape from, and they do it because they feel called to it of God.

For the coming year your Board is asking for the return of Miss Sherwin and Miss Pearson. First Church, Brandon, is going to do without a deaconess. Maclean Mission is seeking to obtain the necessary support for the return of Miss Bearson and if possible another girls' worker - a much-needed addition to its staff. The peaconess Board has not the resources to finance this worker but is hoping that some arrangements may be made for her employment.

Deaconess support has been provided as follows: First Church, Brandon one deaconess Women's Missionary Society ywo deaconesses

The Deaconess Aid Society after a magnificent effort reached its whole year's objective in seven months in order to enter the United Church Women's Union without an encumbrance.

The amount required for salaries to the end of the Deaconess year on Aug. 31 is \$999.96, and receipts to come diffic that time are \$500.00, which with the balance on hand on April 30th will leave cash on hand to close the year \$4.84.

No decision has yet been made by the General Council as to the future organization of the Deaconess work so that it seems necessary to ask this Conference to appoint some Board to continue the work of your present Board until such time as the General Council take action. We are therefore submitting our recommendations as to the sampasitis membership of the Board for 1926-7.

THE GIMLI FRESH AIR CAMP DEPARTMENT

The Fresh Air camp in its twenty-first year of work enjoyed a very successful season. In all 669 mothers and children were given a holiday for ten days each at Lake Winnipeg. These went in five patties each under an experienced worker and camper. Every party but one was considerably over the strength of that of the previous year and the group leaders were kept very busy indeed.

Besides the usual maintenance expenses for salaries, railway fares, food, etc., there was paid in full a repair and replacements item, and \$53432 \$504.77 pets on the electric light plant which was drawn on to pay the babance of the electric light plant bill. The new plant has been a great blessing to the camp and the Church may now feel that it is not in any way endangering the lives of any of its children so far as fire at came is concerned and so far as the alimination of of all coal oil lamps, etc. can help in that.

A summary of the Financial Statement for the year May 1st, 1925 to April 30th 1926 shows the following:

For the coming year a great program is being looked forwrard to since the union of the Gimli Camp and the Robertson Camp makes possible many things that could not be handled by either of these camps alone. It is not for this Board to go into that in detail as your Board has relinquished the management of its camp to a new Board composed of the members of the camp committees of both the camps. The one action of the new Board which is of interest to the former Methodist camp authorities is the change of the name of the camp from The Gimli Fresh Air Camp to

that of the Sparling Fresh Air Camp so that the two camps of the United Church are commemorating the work of two of the great leaders of the two churches of the union, and, in the case of the Sparling Camp, one of the moving spirits of the camp in the days of its beginnings. We feel sure that this will commend itself to all.

In conclusion your Board wishes to thanks all who helped make the camp year of 1925 such a successful one, and to pray your interest and support of the new camps in their enlarged activities under union management.
