Report of the Board of Management of the Toronto Deaconess Home and Training School.

To tell the story of the year's work in connection with the Deaconess Home and Training School is a hopeless task for the Board of Management.

The influence and opportunities are greater than ever before and every department shows extension and blessing.

From Winnipeg to St. John's, Nfld, the workers go to and fro at the Master's bidding, cheered by His presence, inspired by His love, and their deeds are sermons that penetrate closed doors, often melting the hardest hearts.

The avenues of ministration are ever increasing, and the growing demand for deaconesses but makes the need for a larger Training School more imperative. Seven years ago, many thought the Home too large, but for more than a year every available nook and corner in the building has been occupied, and seven of the deaconesses have been obliged to seek shelter elsewhere. If the Home were double the size, it would not be too large for a work that thrives on all its sides.

The queenly gift of a Rest Home has been made by Mrs. W. E. H. Massey. It is situated a few miles east of Toronto, on Dentonia Farm. The interior is arranged in


a style that leaves nothing to be desired, either as to elegance of furnishing or convenience of appliances. This cottage, where the oft-weary deaconess may "Come apart and rest awhile," is to be kept open the whole year, and the generous donor has kindly offered to be responsible for its maintenance.

From each department comes a report of intense interest, for the work of deaconesses is not the task of hirelings, but the enthusiasm of devotees. They "must become all things to all men, that by all means they may save some." They endeavor to touch people at all points by some method or other, to show them the practical and sympathetic side of religion, and by a constant and earnest entreaty seek to win them for Christ. They look upon "the world as their parish" and their first duty not to those who need them, but to those who need them most, irrespective of race or creed.

The relief sisters, as they patiently unravel the stories of want, misery, and sin, and try to help those who have hardly a spark of spirit or energy left to help themselves, preach Christ as the one hope of new help and strength.

At Christmas, when all are reminded that "God loved and gave," it was made possible through the kindness of friends to carry some of His love-gifts unto the smallest, the dingiest homes, where the messengers found a short road to hearts closed by unkindness and neglect.

In the Rescue work, where the white hand beckons the sorrowful and lost into the ways of blessedness and peace, many have responded throughout the year.

Constitution of the Board of Management.

1. There shall be a Conference Board of Management of twenty-one members—seven ministers, seven laymen, and seven women—appointed by the Conference, to exercise a general control of the interests of this form of work, and to have the management of the Toronto Deaconess Home, with power to appoint trustees for the holding of property and receiving bequests in trust for the Home.
2. The Board of Management shall be appointed by the Annual Conference for such term of service as the Annual Conference shall decide.
3. The Board of Management shall annually report to Conference both the names and work of the Deaconesses, and the approval of the annual Conference shall be necessary for the continuance of any Deaconess in her work.
4. No person shall be licensed by the Conference before being first recommended by the Board of Management and by a Quarterly Official Board, and no person shall receive such certificate until she shall have served a probation of two years of continuous service, and shall be over twenty-three years of age.

Rules for the Admission of Candidates for the Office of Deaconess to the Deaconess Home.

Young women who hereafter desire to become candidates for the office and work of a Deaconess shall be required to meet the following conditions :

1. They must make application in due form, as provided by the Board.
2. They must be recommended for the work on the report of the Superintendent.
3. They must undergo a medical examination by the consulting physician of the Home, not only on admission, but before being licensed.
4. They must present a certificate showing that they have passed the course prescribed for students of the Training School.
5. None shall be admitted as candidates for the office of Deaconess who are more than thirty-five or less than twenty-two years of age, except by vote of the Managers.
6. Candidates shall also consent to observe the established rules and regulations of the Home, and to abide by the decisions of the Superintendent, cheerfully and willingly giving all their time to the work assigned them. Any Deaconess in training who may wish to retire from the work is required to give notice to the Board of Management at a regular monthly meeting. In case the work of any Deaconess should prove unsatisfactory to the Board of Management, she may be requested to retire.

General Rules for Deaconess Work.

1. The duties of the Deaconesses are to minister to the poor, visit the sick, pray for the dying, care for the orphan, seek the wandering, comfort the sorrowing, labor to save the sinning, and devote themselves fully to such forms of Christian work as may be suited to their abilities.

2. No vow of perpetual service shall be exacted from any Deaconess, and she shall be at liberty to relinquish her position as a Deaconess at any time, upon giving three months' notice to the Board of Management.

3. No salaries shall be paid; the work of the Deaconess being done for the love of Christ, and in His name.

4. Deaconesses will, if able, pay their own board and expenses, either wholly or in part; or, if unable, they are entitled to comfortable maintenance and an allowance for clothing during their connection with the Home. The conditions under which each shall be admitted shall be determined by the Board of Management, after full knowledge is obtained of her financial ability.

5. A simple costume shall be worn, consisting of dark navy blue dress, cloak, bonnet with white silk ties, and linen turn-over collars and cuffs.

6. Any Deaconess retiring from the work shall cease to wear the costume, and shall return her parchment to the Board of Management.

7. None shall solicit money unless duly authorized, and all donations and money received, where service is rendered, shall be paid into the treasury of the Home, to be applied towards the general expenses.

8. All members of the household are required to give such portion of each day to practical work as the Superintendent may direct.

9. The appointment of Deaconesses shall be made annually at the July meeting, and shall date from the first day of September following such appointment; provided, however, that appointments may be made at other times, when it shall be considered by the Board reasonable and proper in the best interests of the work. Unless for special reasons Deaconesses shall not be appointed for more than three years in succession to any one church or station. Special reasons shall be understood to mean changing of pastors and the needs of missions and hospitals and the work carried on in special cases.

10. When working singly, each Deaconess shall be under the direction of the pastor of the church with which she is connected. When associated together in a Home, all the members of the Home shall be subordinate to and directed by the Superintendent placed in charge.

11. Pastors of churches where Deaconesses are employed are requested to report to the Superintendent the character of the work done. She shall in turn report to the Board at each monthly meeting.

12. A regular vacation of one month shall be granted each Deaconess annually, during which time her allowance shall be continued.

13. No absence of a Deaconess from her field of labor, exceeding the time of the regular vacation, shall be permitted by the Superintendent, except with the consent of the Board of Management.

14. After three years of unbroken service, except by the regular vacation, a licensed Deaconess shall be granted three months' leave of absence from her field, if her desire be to spend that time in study, during which time the ordinary allowance shall be granted, if necessary.

15. Any Deaconess having been granted an extended leave of absence, and being prepared to return to work at the expiration of the term allowed her, shall communicate with the Board of Management one month before so doing.

16. Any Deaconess being granted an extended leave of absence, and wishing to remain for a longer or shorter period than the time allowed, shall require the consent of the Board of Management in either case.

17. Any Deaconess remaining away from the Home longer than the term of her leave of absence, without permission from the Board of Management, shall not be received back into the work, unless with the consent of the said Board.

Training School Regulations.

1. The purpose of this School is to furnish Biblical and practical training for our Methodist young people who expect to enter city, home, or foreign mission fields, and also for those who desire better equipment for Sunday School work.

2. The School is open to both men and women; those residing in the city being admitted as day students, who shall have the privilege of all class work and lectures, on the payment of the entrance fee.

All students desiring to enter Deaconess work must reside in the Home while taking the course of study.

Conditions of Admission.

3. Candidates must be members of some Evangelical church, and must be well recommended. It is further required that they have a good common school education.

Expenses of Students.

4. No charges are made for instruction, but an entrance fee of \$2.00 is payable by each student.

\$3.00 per week shall be paid by each student residing in the Home, for room, board, fuel and light.

Suggestions to Applicants.

5. In making application to enter the School, write to the Superintendent for applicant's blanks. Fill out and return. The application will then come in proper form before the Committee, and will be duly acted upon. Each student is expected to furnish (for personal use) blankets, towels, napkin ring, toilet and laundry soap, also kitchen aprons, heavy under-flannel (with sleeves), overshoes and leggings, also gossamer and umbrella, as the work may require one to be out-doors in all kinds of weather; she is also required to wear rubber heels. Napkin ring and everything to be washed must be plainly marked with full name.

Students should bring religious books of general reference, such as may be convenient. Room is valuable in a large city—it is especially so in our building. Bring only one trunk. Students in the School do not wear a uniform. The clothing should be simple and serviceable, special attention being paid to the comfort and health of wearer. Dentistry, shopping and dressmaking, should be attended

to before coming, that studies may not be interrupted by these matters. For the same reason it is desirable that students should have been vaccinated within a year of entering.

How to Reach the Home.

6. Go through the lower door at the Union Station, take Church street car, get off at Wilton avenue, and walk two blocks east to Jarvis street. The school is a few doors north of Wilton avenue, on the east side of the street.

Regulations for Students in Residence.

7. These are only such as have been found necessary for the harmonious working of so large a family. Among them are: All are desired to be prompt and regular at meals, and to take out-door exercise every day. Calls are received on Friday evening only, except in special cases. Only Sunday evening and one other evening a week are spent outside, unless by special permission. Food is served only at meals, and all fare alike except in case of sickness.

It is earnestly hoped that students will appreciate the privileges of the School. It exists only by the labors of teachers freely giving their time, and only for the student's good. No teacher, lecturer, or officer of the School receives salary for his or her services. We expect, in return, that all students will manifest the spirit of Christ and strive in every respect to make the School a success.

A One Year's Course.

8. The full course of study covers eight months. It is most desirable that students should complete the entire

course. It is hoped, however, that many who may find this an impossibility will avail themselves of such parts of the course as their circumstances will permit.

Practical Work.

9. One afternoon of every week is devoted to house-to-house visitation, usually under the general direction of the city pastors. Industrial schools occupy the students' Saturday afternoons, and they teach regularly in the mission church Sunday Schools of the city.

Domestic Training.

10. All students are required to spend some time each day in gaining a practical knowledge of housework.

Special.

11. We hope to be able to give assistance, at least in the way of loans, to some of those who are really called of God to enter Missionary or Deaconess work, and who cannot, by any possibility, enter the School without help. To support a student in the School will cost about one hundred dollars. We call the attention of friends to this opportunity of putting a "substitute" into either of these departments of Christian work.

12. Pastors and others are earnestly requested to call the attention of suitable young men and women to the opportunities of study offered here, and to the urgent need of workers in Missionary and Deaconess fields. The Superintendent will be glad to correspond with any one on this subject.

Commencement Exercises.

The Commencement Exercises were held in the Metropolitan Church, on Sunday, May 7, Rev. C. W. Gallagher, D.D., of the National Training School, Washington, preached the baccalaureate sermon at 11 a.m.

On Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock, the Graduating Exercises were held, Dr. Sparling presiding.

Miss Edith Weekes, B.A., read the Class Essay, "The Value of Ideals."

The Class Hymn, "Go Forth," was composed by Miss Josephine Dowler.

Miss Scott presented diplomas to twenty-two graduates.

Addresses were delivered by C. D. Massey, Esq., and Dr. Gallagher.

Miss Millet and Mrs. W. T. Merry kindly rendered excellent services in their message of song for which the Board are deeply indebted.


El Far=Reaching Work.


A Busy Day.

We want to take them all. However, we think of a way out. All the boys who cannot go to Whitby are invited to a picnic at the Island. The faces brighten into a broad grin, and one boy throwing up his cap, bursts out enthusiastically, "Hurrah for the deaconesses."

The exciting part of the afternoon has come. William, the janitor, with an assistant, takes the boys into the big bath-room, from which issue yells of delight as the cold spray deluges them. The deaconesses are busy sorting and

When I was very small, my mistress, who was then well and happy, used to whisper to me that some day when I grew to be a dollar bill, I would go to the Deaconess Home, where they would use me for the children at the Fresh Air Home. As I grew bigger and stronger, it made me feel very sad to see my dear little mistress growing thinner and paler every day. Annual Meeting.

The eleventh Annual Meeting of the Deaconess Aid Society was held on the afternoon of May 9th, 1905, in the lecture room of the Metropolitan Church. The President, Mrs. D. G. Sutherland, occupied the chair.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. G. M. Brown, President of the Conference.

The various reports of the Society were presented, and on motion of Mrs. Torrington, Mrs. Taylor, Mrs. F. N. G. Starr and Miss Brown, were adopted.

Dr. C. W. Gallagher gave a most interesting address on the Deaconess Work in Washington, giving an account of the hospital work from the beginning.

Eleventh Annual Report of the Toronto Deaconess Society for the Year Ending May, 1905.

The Society can again place on record its gratitude to our Heavenly Father for the continued manifestation of His favor in the steady growth and development of the work.

We have passed another milestone in the history of our organization, and we are led to say in realization of what has been accomplished in so brief a period and under circumstances so difficult at times, "What hath God wrought?" Twelve years ago the work was undertaken amidst general apathy, and some opposition on the part of those outside the few who saw opening up before our

beloved Church a sphere of usefulness for women, such as would be for the blessing of the community as well as to the advantage of the Church and the glory of God. To-day the opposition has practically disappeared, the apathy has given way to warm appreciation, and, in the face of what has been accomplished, not only those interested in the inauguration of the movement, but those who doubted its success, are led to praise God for the enthusiasm that established and developed the work in our midst.

There is now a spirit of enquiry and encouragement that leads to the belief that the next year or two will see such marked development in the deaconess work as shall test our capacity for providing the necessary workers and funds. As to this we may say that already we have felt the need for enlarged facilities in the Home, accommodation having had to be provided outside for four of the deaconesses last year, and while the response to the financial demands of the work has been most gratifying, there is abundant room for the encouragement of the spirit of liberality towards this important department of our church work.

We might remind again our ministerial and lay brethren of the helpfulness of deaconess work in connection with the pastorate, but more especially amongst the poor, whose needs require special, loving and watchful interest. The cost of a deaconess is but \$200 annually, bare maintenance, while the advantages of constant contact with the membership and personal work among the young and the needy, make her indispensable wherever she has been employed. It is gratifying to note that the number of those offering

themselves for deaconess work continues to increase. We are abundantly thankful, however, for the signs of the times, and know that He who is opening this effectual door for the ministration of women, will provide the needed financial and other requirements.

There are now 33 deaconesses in the work throughout Canada: 18 in Toronto; 3 in Hamilton (one of whom is supported by a good friend of the work); 4 in St. John's, Nfld.; 2 in Halifax; 1 in Kingston; 1 in Montreal; 1 in Belleville; 1 in Napanee; 1 in London; 1 in Winnipeg. There have been 24 students in the training school this past year, 22 of whom are graduating, the other two having only entered in January: 6 of this class have been accepted for work in the foreign field.

The interest and enthusiasm of the class this year has shown itself in a most practical way indeed, in the presenting of a beautiful piano for the music room of the anticipated new home.

During the year there have been held three open meetings which were largely attended, with an average attendance of fourteen; and nine business meetings where reports have been given of work done by the deaconesses in connection with the city churches and missions, and a general report of outside work by our much-loved Superintendent, Miss E. Jean Scott, to whose persistent energy and prayerful and self-denying interest is due much of the success of the Society. Her faith and enthusiasm are an inspiration to all who come in contact with her.

We have again to thank the many kind friends of the

work for their assistance in very many ways, and especially would we remember the friends for contributing for another year the following magazines and periodicals:—*Christian Guardian, Epworth Era, Methodist Magazine, Wesleyan Missionary Outlook, New York Outlook, Kitchen Magazine, Monthly Letter W.M.S., Palm Branch and Holy Living.* We would again thank the Rev. and Mrs. A. M. White of Austin, Ill., for the *North Western Christian Advocate*.

We also desire to thank Mrs. Massey-Treble for a beautiful dinner and tea set of china, to arrange a table for forty-eight, which she presented to the Home at Christmas. We would also thank Mr. Chester D. Massey for the very beautiful and useful gift of eight silver sugar bowls and cream pitchers, four silver pudding dishes, three silver soup tureens, which were presented in memory of the late Mrs. C. D. Massey.

We also express our deep gratitude again to Drs. U. Ogden, Powell, Shore, MacCallum, Price, Culbert and E. King, for their kind services given to the members of the Home.

We have to record with regret the removal during the past year of our Hon. President, the late Mrs. J. A. Williams, one who always took deepest interest in the work of the Society, even when unable to maintain personal touch with the organization. Mrs. Williams was appointed on the first board, twelve years ago, by the Toronto Conference, and throughout the history of the Society lent her warm, active co-operation in promoting its aims. Her

face in our councils will long be remembered, and her loving interest and influence cherished by the organization through the years to come. "She hath ceased from her labors and her works do follow her."

The Society would express in conclusion, its deepest gratitude for the many marks of Divine direction and helps that have attended the year just closed, not only in the growth of the work, but the results accomplished through its humble efforts. We press upon the church the necessity for the constant remembrance of the work before the Throne of Grace. We realize more and more the necessity of prayerful consecration on the part of all interested, as well as those who have given themselves personally to this ministry of love. Pray that not only may workers and means be forthcoming, but that wisdom, love of heart and grace of speech and life may be given those who take the place of under-shepherds in the folds of Christ.

**Constitution
of the
Toronto Deaconess Aid Society.**

First.—The object of this society shall be to furnish necessary supplies for the DEACONESS HOME AND TRAINING SCHOOL; and aid, in every possible way in developing and advancing the work of Deaconesses in the Methodist Church; also, to secure the co-operation and help of the churches in the city and vicinity in the work of the Deaconess Home.

Second.—Any person contributing fifty cents or more per year shall be a member of this Society.

Third.—The Officers shall be a President, (three or more) Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. These shall be elected at the Annual Meeting and shall continue in office for one year, or until their successor shall be elected. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting of the Board, notice having been given at the previous meeting.

Fourth.—At each Annual Meeting the Society shall appoint a Board of Directors, to whom shall be entrusted the business of the Society.

Fifth.—The Standing Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors, as the need of the work may require.

Sixth.—The Board of Directors shall, one month in advance of the Annual Meeting, appoint a committee of three, who shall recommend to the Annual Meeting the names of persons to be voted for as Officers and Members of the Board of Directors.

Seventh.—This Constitution may be amended at any Annual Meeting, notice of such amendment having been given at the previous monthly meeting of the Directors.

By-Laws

First.—The Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held not later than the fifteenth of May of each year.

Second.—The Board of Directors shall meet on the third Wednesday of each month, at three o'clock, p.m., excepting the month of the Annual Meeting.

Third.—There shall be a Furnishing Committee, Library Committee, Printing Committee, Medical Supplies Committee, Costume Committee, House Committee, and Finance Committee.

Fourth.—The Treasurer shall disburse all moneys coming into her hands, subject to the action of the Board.

Fifth.—It shall be the duty of all the members of the Board of Directors to attend the monthly meetings, and endeavor, in all ways possible, to assist in promoting the work of the Deaconesses.

Sixth.—If any member absents herself from three consecutive meetings of the Board, unless in case of illness or absence from the city, her place may be filled at the pleasure

of the Directors. In case of a member of the Board resigning during the year, her place may be filled at any regular meeting, notice having been given one month previously.

Seventh—That notice of Annual Meeting be announced in the *Christian Guardian* one week before the time proposed for said meeting, and that announcements be made from the several church pulpits on the Sabbath previous to the holding of this meeting, and that these announcements shall be considered sufficient notification to the members.

Eighth—These By-laws may be amended at any stated meeting by majority of the members present, notice having been given at the previous meeting.

Ninth—That the Officers and Conveners of Committees form the Executive of the Society.

Five shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
